## **I. INTRODUCTION**

Climate change refers to long-term shifts in temperatures and weather patterns in local, regional, and global climates. Climate change is characterized by the changes in climatic parameters such as temperature, precipitation, wind speed etc. due to increased concentration of Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions generated majorly through human activities.

This increased concentration of GHG emission has resulted in global warming which is posing a serious threat to our planet. While the environmental degradation is evident through multiple catastrophic climate events which continue to cause significant socio-economic damage across the world, collective actions must be taken globally by all the stakeholders including Businesses, Society and Regulatory Bodies.

GMR Hyderabad International Airport Limited (“GHIAL” or “the Company”) understands the seriousness of climate change and the risks associated with it. We are committed to reducing carbon footprint and minimizing impacts with climate resilience programs that have mitigation and adoption strategies at GHIAL.

Through this Policy, GHIAL aims to:

- 1) reduce the organization’s carbon footprint.
- 2) set and achieve net zero carbon emission targets with a program.
- 3) encourage and provide impetus to natural resource conservation, green infrastructure development, energy efficiency & energy conservation, renewable energy generation and use, green transportations, maintaining carbon sink through extensive greenery, operational efficiency, sustainable procurements, and use of biofuels & sustainable aviation fuels.
- 4) encourage our value chain partners/stakeholders to adopt green initiatives and practices on climate actions.
- 5) assess and address climate change risk and opportunities periodically.
- 6) encourage effective communication on climate risks and opportunities through capacity building and awareness.



#### IV. POLICY STATEMENT

GHIAL is into operation, management and development of the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport situated at Shamshabad, Hyderabad, India and relies on its employees, suppliers, value chain partners, and other stakeholders for business continuity; takes cognizance that climate change risks can impact its operations.

GHIAL's aim to fulfil its commitments and objectives towards climate actions through the following broad-level actions:

- b) develop training and awareness-raising activities for our staff and external stakeholders through value chain partners and for society in general concerning pro-environmental behavior and climate action.
- c) support the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by taking urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts (SDG 13)<sup>1</sup>.
- d) Alignment with the ICAO's Long-term Global Aspiration Goal (LTAG) **for international aviation of net-zero carbon emissions by 2050.**
- e) Participation in the Airport Carbon Accreditation programs of the Airports Council International.
